

Hamilton Fuqua School of Business



Duke Start-Up Challenge: A year-long competition for student entrepreneurs.

DukeGEN: A community of alumni entrepreneurs.

CASE (Center for the Advancement of Social Entrepreneurship): A research and education center focusing on social entrepreneurship.

SEAD (Social Entrepreneurship Accelerator at Duke): SEAD brings together interdisciplinary partners across Duke University to create an integrated global health social entrepreneurship hub for diverse stakeholders across the globe.

P4E (Program for Entrepreneurship): The Program for Entrepreneurship helps students start new ventures.
